Graveside services were held on Saturday, April 4, 2020 at Sacred Heart Cemetery. Carolyn passed away March 30, 2020 at Gainesville Nursing and Rehab in Gainesville, Tx. She was born in San Antonio, TX on September 27, 1930 to Mary Emma Wiesman and lived in Muenster most of her life. She graduated from Sacred Heart High School and on April 4, 1951 married Joe Henry Walterscheid. They made their home in Muenster where they raised their four children. Carolyn worked as a waitress at Rohmer's restaurant for many years and then at the Jerrell Sewing Factory.
