Even after, Janet would still come out to Superior frequently to visit her co-workers and hug and remind them how special they were to her. She had a giant heart to serve others in her spare time, and loved being a volunteer and cooking for all the benefits for CASA and Meals on Wheels.

Janet was a generous person. Her love language was gifts. She always remembered everyone's birthdays and had a special ability to find just the perfect gift for each person. She spoiled her grandkids with clothes, candy, games, and kites every Easter. She especially loved Christmas. When her kids were little, Janet would hide all the gifts at the flower shop because she loved to see the surprise on all their faces when they unwrapped them. Janet also found anonymous ways to help others, including her co-workers, when

they were experiencing hard times, and she never wanted credit for all the many times she reached out to help others.

Janet absolutely loved people. She had a big heart, a beautiful, bright smile, and was always quick to laugh and have a good time. Janet especially enjoyed all her friends and family at the lake camping as well as shooting the breeze at "The W." She never left a campsite or a party without making new friends. Many of the cross stitches that she sewed for years, like the Last Supper, the Footprints poem, the Klement Family tree, as well as pictures for weddings and birthdays, still hang on the walls of many family members Janet loved.

Janet was an amazing cook who rarely used a recipe, just "a little of this, and a little of that," she would say. We will all miss her wonderful cooking, especially her Thanksgiving dressing. She never minded making extra for anyone who requested it. She was known all over town for her potato salad, her popcorn balls, pumpkin rolls, cinnamon rolls, along with many other treats. Her kids' personal favorites that she made were okra gumbo, backbone sauerkraut, chicken noodle soup, cooked cabbage, "stuff", liver and onions, and her hobos. Janet also enjoyed canning picante sauce and tomato juice. Janet was a smart cookie. She had the best practical tips for just about any situation, like "flipping babies" so they would get their days and nights straight. She would often tell people "Sit Down" when they visited and everyone needed to "Be Nice!" Janet had a positive attitude on life and always wanted people to be "happy, happy, happy." Even in the hardest of times, she was never a complainer. Being a Klement, she was a doer and a fixer. Janet managed to be prepared for everything and seemed to always have an extra of anything for anyone in need, just in case.

Janet was the biggest Randy Rogers Band fan, and she and her sisters and nieces attended just as many of their concerts as they could to support them. She also loved spending time at the casinos with her siblings and sisters and brothers-in-law. They made a lot of memories on their numerous trips to

Colorado, Alabama, Shreveport, New Mexico, and Oklahoma, where they shared countless stories and tons of laughs along the way. Their last siblings' trip to Shreveport just 3 weeks ago will be a lasting memory that Janet's sisters and brother will treasure forever.
