



Jerome Robert 'Jerry' Sobeczek

November 20, 1930 - January 7, 2023

Funeral service for Jerome Robert 'Jerry' Sobeczek will be held at 2:00 PM on Friday, January 13, 2023 at Scott Funeral Home in Saint Jo. Burial to follow at Coker Cemetery. Visitation will be held from 6:00-8:00 PM on Thursday, January 12, 2023 at Scott Funeral Home in Saint Jo. Mr. Sobeczek passed away on Saturday, January 7, 2023.

Jerry was born in San Antonio on November 20, 1930 to Robert Joseph and Rosalie Hedwig 'Rosie' (Skrzycki) Sobeczek. His first job at the age of 16 was at Alamo Iron Works in San Antonio. He graduated from Breckenridge High School in San Antonio. While the draft was still in force, he preferred to join the Navy where he worked on refrigeration diesel engines. While he was in the Korean War, he was injured during a blast of a gun going off too close to his ear and had to be lifted off ship for surgery the same day that the United States landed on the Moon. He had a medical discharge so he went to the University of Texas in Austin where he studied Mechanical Engineering. He graduated and went to work for Pearl Brewery where he remained until he changed to Associated Milk Producers Incorporated (AMPI) in San Antonio as the Southern Region Engineer which involved plants in Oklahoma City, Muenster, El Paso, Sulphur Springs, and Stephenville. He retired in 1992 and moved to Bowie to be a rancher.

Jerry is survived by his loving wife: Ruth Coker Sobeczek of Bowie; sons: Charlie and Irene DeWolfe of Bowie, Rev. Todd DeWolfe of Edmond, Oklahoma, and Robert Sobeczek of San Antonio; daughters: Nadine and Jeff

Berger of La Vernia, Texas, Lori Parker of San Antonio, and Sharon Mann of San Antonio; 10 grandchildren; 3 great grandchildren; brother: Clarence and Ollie Sobeczek of La Vernia; sisters: Helen and Mark Lyssy of La Vernia and Frances and Erwin Moczygemba of San Antonio.

He was preceded in death by his parents: Robert and Rosie Sobeczek; brothers: Edwin and Herman Sobeczek; and special uncle: Gene Skrzycki.

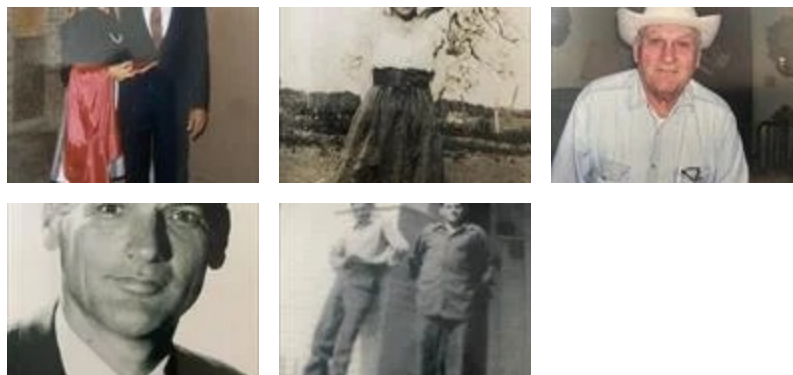
